THE SPIRITUAL DIMENSIONS OF OUR MINISTRY

Going on a GFCC short-term mission trip is not the same as taking a vacation to an exotic place. Our mission trips are not 'getaways' from responsibility nor are they 'volunteer vacations' to feel self-satisfied by 'doing good'. We go as ambassadors of Jesus Christ to work among people that we do hope to see again, if only in eternity. And, as true ambassadors, the burden is upon us to bridge the cultural differences necessary to reach them for him.

GFCC short-term mission trips want to place emphasis on ministry within our teams. We go not only to minister to others, but also to get outside of our own comfort zones. We go to place ourselves in a position to hear God speak to us in ways we don't always hear at home. This requires going beyond being nice and getting along. This requires true Christian community which develops true spiritual unity within our team. We agree to resolve conflict in a Christ-honoring way. We also agree to facilitate mutual growth by sharing our own insights and experiences during times set aside for spiritual reflection, prayer and praise to God. By serving others together in community we will experience the blessing of God.

EXPECTATIONS FOR EXEMPLARY PERSONAL CONDUCT

We will always adhere to the specific cultural expectations and guidelines provided for us by our on-site ministry partners. In other words, "when in Rome..." This pertains to things like dress, food, drink, jewelry, gift giving, picture taking, etc. We will always defer to our onsite ministry partners with regards to what we should or should not do.

While visiting, you will want to wear comfortable, modest clothing.

In adapting to the contextual expectations of those we seek to serve, there are some practical restrictions we all agree to follow together for the duration of each project. No alcohol, tobacco or illegal drugs are to be used at all. In addition, there should be no hint of sexual immorality.

All participants in GFCC short-term mission projects are expected to adhere to these standards of conduct. Anyone who cannot accept these for the duration of a project should not apply for it. The trip leader is obligated by GFCC policy to dismiss anyone who betrays the trust of the group by violating these standards, and his/her decision in the matter will be final.

OUR BIBLICAL MODEL FOR MINISTRY

Our model for ministry is Jesus Christ. Having come as one of us, we know He understands us and knows the solutions to our problems and concerns. In the same way, we who go to other cultures to share the Gospel must do so with humility and sensitivity to the cultural context of their needs.

All our actions and relationships should be modeled upon those of our Lord's life and ministry. By going to serve and not to be served (Mark 10:45), GFCC teams truly discover what Jesus meant when He said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive." (Acts 20:35)

Our behavior has a much more profound impact upon people than what we tell them. Therefore, it is critical that we model behavior that is truly Christ-like, both publicly and privately. In coming alongside our brothers and sisters in Christ in under-resourced places, we need to be sensitive to their worldview and willingly lay aside everything that might hinder our ministry there. We must bear the responsibility of bridging the cultural differences, and we want to be perceived as ambassadors, not "tourists" or "vacationers."
